God's Beloved

Marlee is new to Elevation, and it is only through God's provision that she with us. She is the foster daughter of pastors Paul and Lori Sommerville (The pastors of the church where Elevation is located). Marlee's dad died of an overdose when she was just four years old, and her mother is currently in recovery. Within the public school system, she was encouraged to choose her sexual preference and gender identity. Now, she is learning daily that her identity is the beloved daughter of God. As we come around Marlee as a community of believers, she is teaching us that her success is dependent on us surrounding her with love, and this challenges the entire Elevation community to reexamine basic assumptions of our own self-oriented lives.

Like Marlee, we too hear the still small voice that whispers softly and declares loudly, "You are my Beloved." We are called to equip Marlee to hear that voice in a world that shouts, "You are no good, you are worthless, you are nobody." Nouwen (1992) wrote, "Every time you listen with great attentiveness to the voice that calls you the Beloved, you will discover within yourself a desire to hear that voice longer and more deeply." Considering the trauma Marlee has been exposed to at such a young age, the statistics are not in her favor. By God's grace, we have the privilege of equipping her with bread for the long journey ahead. As she learns to claim her belovedness, her identity will be secure, and she will be able to live both successes and failures as the beloved.
